Total FTE	The total number of filled and temporarily vacant FTE positions during Fall 2002 paid from funds under library control. FTE in this report is calculated by summing all hours worked per work and dividing by 40.
Weekly Hours Open	Unduplicated count of hours open for both main and branches during a typical week, usually the Fall.
Weekly Gate Count	The number of persons who physically enter the library facilities in a typical week.
Weekly Reference Transactions	<p>The total number of reference transactions in a typical week. A reference transaction is an information contact that involves the knowledge, use, commendation, interpretation, or instruction in the use of one or more information sources by a member of the library staff. ## Carnegie Categories

### Carnegie Classification Code

The 2000 Carnegie Classification includes all colleges and universities in the United States that are degree-granting and accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education. The 2000 edition classifies institutions based on their degree-granting activities from 1995-96 through 1997-98.

- 15 Doctoral/Research Universities—Extensive: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the doctorate. They award 50 or more doctoral degrees per year across at least 15 disciplines
- 16 Doctoral/Research Universities—Intensive: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the doctorate. They award at least ten doctoral degrees/1 per year across three or more disciplines, 2 or at least 20 doctoral degrees per year overall.
- 21 Master's Colleges and Universities I: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. They award 40 or more master's degrees per year across three or more disciplines.
- 22 Master's (Comprehensive) Colleges and Universities II: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. They award 20 or more master's degrees per year.
- 31 Baccalaureate Colleges—Liberal Arts: These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate programs. They award at least half of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields.
- 32 Baccalaureate Colleges—General: These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate programs. They award less than half of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields.
- 33 Baccalaureate/Associate's Colleges: These institutions are undergraduate colleges where the majority of conferrals are at the sub baccalaureate level (associate's degrees and certificates), but bachelor's degrees account for at least ten percent of undergraduate awards.
- 40 Associate's Colleges: These institutions offer associate's degrees and certificate programs but, with few exceptions, award no baccalaureate degrees.

Specialized Institutions - These institutions offer degrees ranging from the bachelor's to the doctorate, and typically award a majority of degrees in a single field. The list includes only institutions that are listed as separate campuses in the Higher Education Directory.

### Specialized institutions include:

- 51 Theological seminaries and other specialized faith-related institutions: These institutions primarily offer religious instruction or train members of the clergy.
- 52 Medical schools and medical centers: These institutions award most of their professional degrees in medicine. In some instances, they include other health professions programs, such as dentistry, pharmacy, or nursing.
- 53 Other separate health profession schools: These institutions award most of their degrees in such fields as chiropractic, nursing, pharmacy, or podiatry.
- 54 Schools of engineering and technology: These institutions award most of their bachelor's or graduate degrees in technical fields of study.
- 55 Schools of business and management: These institutions award most of their bachelor's or graduate degrees in business or business related programs.
- 56 Schools of art, music, and design: These institutions award most of their bachelor's or graduate degrees in art, music, design, architecture, or some combination of such fields.
- 57 Schools of law: These institutions award most of their degrees in law.
- 58 Teachers colleges: These institutions award most of their bachelor's or graduate degrees in education or education-related fields.
- 59 Other specialized institutions: Institutions in this category include graduate centers, maritime academies, military institutes, and institutions that do not fit any other classification category.

60 Tribal Colleges and Universities: These colleges are, with few exceptions, tribally controlled and located on reservations. They are all members of the American Indian Higher Education Consortium.

#### NOTES ON DEFINITIONS

1. Doctoral degrees are as defined in the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) of the U.S. Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics (NCES). This includes the Ph.D. in any field as well as other doctoral-level degrees such as the Doctor of Education, Doctor of Juridical Science, and Doctor of Public Health. It excludes doctoral-level degrees defined as first-professional degrees in IPEDS. For more information, see <http://nces.ed.gov/ipeds>.

Various public library circulation and holdings raw data. Also includes circulation per FTE, per hour open and per capita and holdings per capita data.

### **Education & Staffing Report, 7-1-xxxx** (available in January)

Public library staffing levels and distribution of the staff's highest educational level. Staffing level data includes: total full-time equivalencies (FTE), number full time and part time, and FTE for MLS, librarian, children's librarian and non-custodian positions as well as total hours open per non-custodian FTE. Director's education level and length of work week are displayed.

### **Electronic Services, FYxxxx Data** (available in May)

Selected statistics related to electronic services including: web page hits, uses of electronic resources, electronic subscriptions and materials in electronic format.

### **Featured Reports, FYxxxx Data** (available in the spring)

Reports on changing topics present public library data not displayed in other reports.

### **Financial Statistics Report, FYxxxx Data** (available in February)

Raw and per capita figures for each reporting public library's (including branches) total municipal appropriation, operating income, and salary, materials, other and total operating expenditures. Also included are percent of total operating expenditures spent for salaries, materials and other expenditures.

### **The FYxxxx Municipal Pie...What's Your Share?** (available in March)

Relates the amount expended from the general fund by each city and town on public library service, to the amount expended to operate the entire municipality.

### **Public Library Outlets, FYxxxx Data** (available in May)

Selected statistics relating to public library outlets including: staffing, holdings and circulation.

### **Rankings Report, xxxx Data** (available in March)

Each municipality's rank within its population group and within the entire state based on its library's per capita values for certain income and expenditure data. For services, the indicators are: FTE per 10,000 population, MLS FTE per 10,000, hours open per week, direct and total circulation per capita and holdings per capita.

### **Salaries Report, 7-1-xxxx** (available in January)

Hourly minimum and maximum salaries for up to 17 public library position classifications from Library Director to Custodian. Annual salary for the Library Director is also displayed.

### **Services Report, FYxxxx** (available in January)

Services data includes number of terminals with Internet, average weekly visits, reference questions and hours open. Counts are provided for weekend days open, branches, adult and children's programs and attendance. Average hours open on weekends is also shown.

### **Summary Tables and Graphs, xxxx Data** (available in March)

Statewide, population group and regional totals of various incomes, expenditures, holdings, circulation, services and staffing data. Subject index provided.
