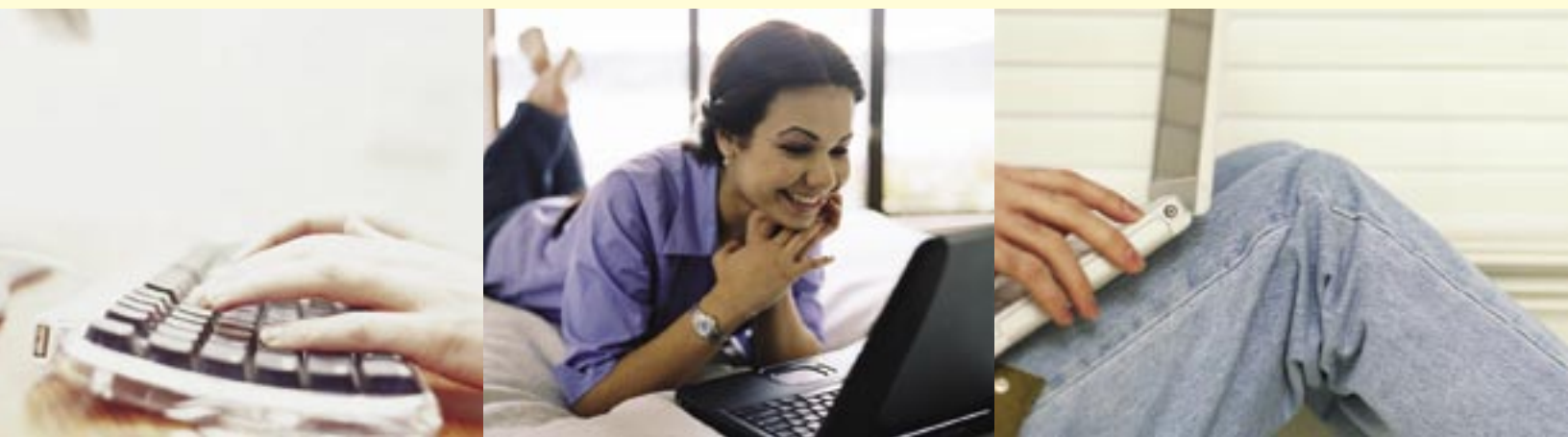

Bush, Christa McAuliffe, Bradford Washburn, Tiger Woods, Leonardo DiCaprio and many others. Logon to *Biography Resource Center* featuring *The Marquis Who's Who*® for more than 330,000 narrative biographies and more than one million thumbnail biographies on notable individuals from around the globe, throughout history and across all disciplines.

Literary Criticism

Uh-oh — those research papers on Stephen King and Samuel Beckett are due in a couple of days and the library is closed. Logon to *Contemporary Literary Criticism*® – *Select* for access to an extensive collection of full-text critical essays on contemporary writers featuring biographical/critical introductions, lists of principal works and sources for further study.

Scholarly Journals and more

That multidisciplinary research project got you down? Logon to *Expanded Academic ASAP*™ to locate authoritative information in nearly 2,000 journals, periodicals, newspapers, magazines and newswires featuring full-text articles on a range of academic disciplines including law, history, psychology, humanities, current events, sociology, communications, and general and library sciences.

Starting your own business? Getting ready to hit the job market? Looking at industry trends and company statistics for investment purposes? Learn all about your competitors and potential employers or develop a list of business prospects with one resource that has it all. Logon to *General BusinessFile ASAP* for business and management articles, broker research reports, trade publications, newspaper articles and company directory listings covering company performance and activity, industry events and trends, standard industry and NAICS classifications and much more.

MBLC offers a directory of Massachusetts special collections of manuscripts and archival materials as well as linking to the six regional library systems. It also provides access to electronic databases from Thomson Gale,™ the leading publisher of electronic reference information. By going to MBLC, residents can access more than 25 million full-text reference materials, magazine and newspaper articles from anywhere Internet access is available, simply by using their library card.
