# **2023 STATE GRANT PROGRAM**

### **Small Libraries in Networks**

#### FACT SHEET

## **Purpose of this Grant Offering**

The Small Libraries in Networks grant round allows the MBLC to help approximately 153 libraries in municipalities with a population of less than 10,000 to participate as full members of an automated resource sharing network. Grant funds received by the network are directly applied to offset each library's annual membership fee.

This grant opportunity also provides an administrative fee to the CW MARS network for coordinating Internet access and manages payment reimbursements for 8 small public libraries receiving internet funding support through the Telecommunications for Resource Sharing program.

#### FY23 Formula

In FY20, the program implemented a new formula, and the overall awards total increased from \$329,025 to \$363,983 in FY21 and \$371,078 in FY22. FY23 awards will continue to use the same formula, with a total expected award amount of approximately \$383,000 to accommodate the five libraries that joined CW MARS in FY22: Brimfield Public Library, Page Memorial Library (Hardwick), Leroy Pollard Memorial Library (New Braintree), Field Memorial Library (Conway) and Tyringham Free Public Library

The three formula components are:

- 1) Common Base Amount (\$1,450)
- 2) **Municipal Need** (E-rate discount percentage [20 -90%] \* \$1,350)
- 3) Relative Network Cost (\$400) (Total appropriated municipal income [TAMI] is greater than 6% of the library's network membership assessment)

Though the budget outcome for FY23 looks promising, whenever there has been the prospect of potential budget to account 7000-9506, it has been understood that the Small Libraries program should be protected as much as possible. Individual libraries rely on this funding to sustain their network membership.

Should cuts be required in FY23, a combination of factors, including a softening the "hold harmless" approach for libraries that have historically received more than the formula-based award, and an overall cut in the base amount will be applied.

## **Eligible Applicants**

Automated resource sharing networks with public libraries in eligible municipalities may apply, including: CLAMS, CW MARS, Minuteman, MVLC, OCLN, and SAILS. Municipalities covered by

the network application must be certified for state aid at the time of the award.

In addition, CW MARS may apply for the administrative costs to manage connectivity for the 8 small non-networked public libraries that receive basic internet support via the Telecommunications for Resource Sharing program.

## **Application Process**

Networks are the applicants. They will receive and administer the grant funds on behalf of the public libraries. Individual public libraries do not apply directly.

## **Anticipated Funding**

This is a formula-driven grant program. If the total amount of funds available should change, the formula priorities described above and contained in the Small Libraries in Networks Review Committee final recommendations (presented to the Board 10/3/19) will be applied to derive the recommended award amounts to each grant recipient.
