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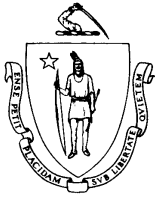

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The FY2006 Municipal Pie...What's Your Library's Share?

The *FY2006 Municipal Pie* report relates the amount expended from the general fund by each city and town on public library service, to the amount expended to operate the entire municipality, for July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006.

Expenditure information for this report comes from the survey report, Schedule A: Actual Revenues and Expenditures in Each Fiscal Year. Town accountants and city auditors submit this report to the Division of Local Services' Bureau of Accounts each fall after the close of the fiscal year. The Division of Local Services can release data for an individual municipality as soon as their report has been reviewed and edited. However, the database for all cities and towns often takes a year or more to finalize. Expenditure data for the *FY2006 Municipal Pie* Report was received from the Department of Revenue in October 2007. Three municipalities included in this report (Hawley, New Ashford, and Washington) do not have public libraries.

Based upon the Uniform Municipal Accounting System (UMAS), revenues and expenditures are reported on Schedule A for general, special revenue, capital project, enterprise and trust funds. Expenditures are submitted in great detail and they are aggregated into a database in the following functional categories: General Government, Police, Fire, Other Public Safety, Education, Public Works/Highways, Human Services, Culture and Recreation (including public library expenditures), Debt Service, Intergovernmental Assessments, Fixed Costs, and Other Expenditures. The Division of Local Services separated public library expenditures from the Culture and Recreation category for inclusion in this report.

This report includes expenditures from the general fund only. Spending from special revenue, enterprise, capital projects, or trust funds is not reflected in these figures. Variations among communities may occur in the "other" and "public works" categories because many communities account for spending on sewer, water, utilities, and other public works functions in enterprise or special revenue funds, rather than the general fund. Nevertheless, the Department of Revenue considers spending from the general fund to be the fairest way to compare operating expenditures from community to community.

State Aid to Public Libraries payments are not included in the FY2006 municipal expenditures data reported for public libraries. These are offset local aid funds which are to be held in a separate account for the library to expend without appropriation and are, therefore, not a revenue source for the general fund. Regional library funds however, do appear in the general fund and have been subtracted from Schedule A expenditures for this report.

In FY2006, of the \$16.5 billion general fund dollars spent by the Commonwealth's municipalities, \$198.2 million was spent on public libraries. The pie chart on page 1 shows the percent of municipal spending from the general fund in various categories. As always, education spending leads, with 46.67% of the pie. Public libraries account for 1.2% of the total expenditures.

This report includes a breakdown of municipalities by population group. Population figures are from the 2006 population estimate.

Please note: The financial data in this report is compiled solely from data provided by the Department of Revenue, Division of Local Services. In some instances it may differ from data reported by libraries to the Board of Library Commissioners on the State Aid to Public Libraries Financial Report Form.

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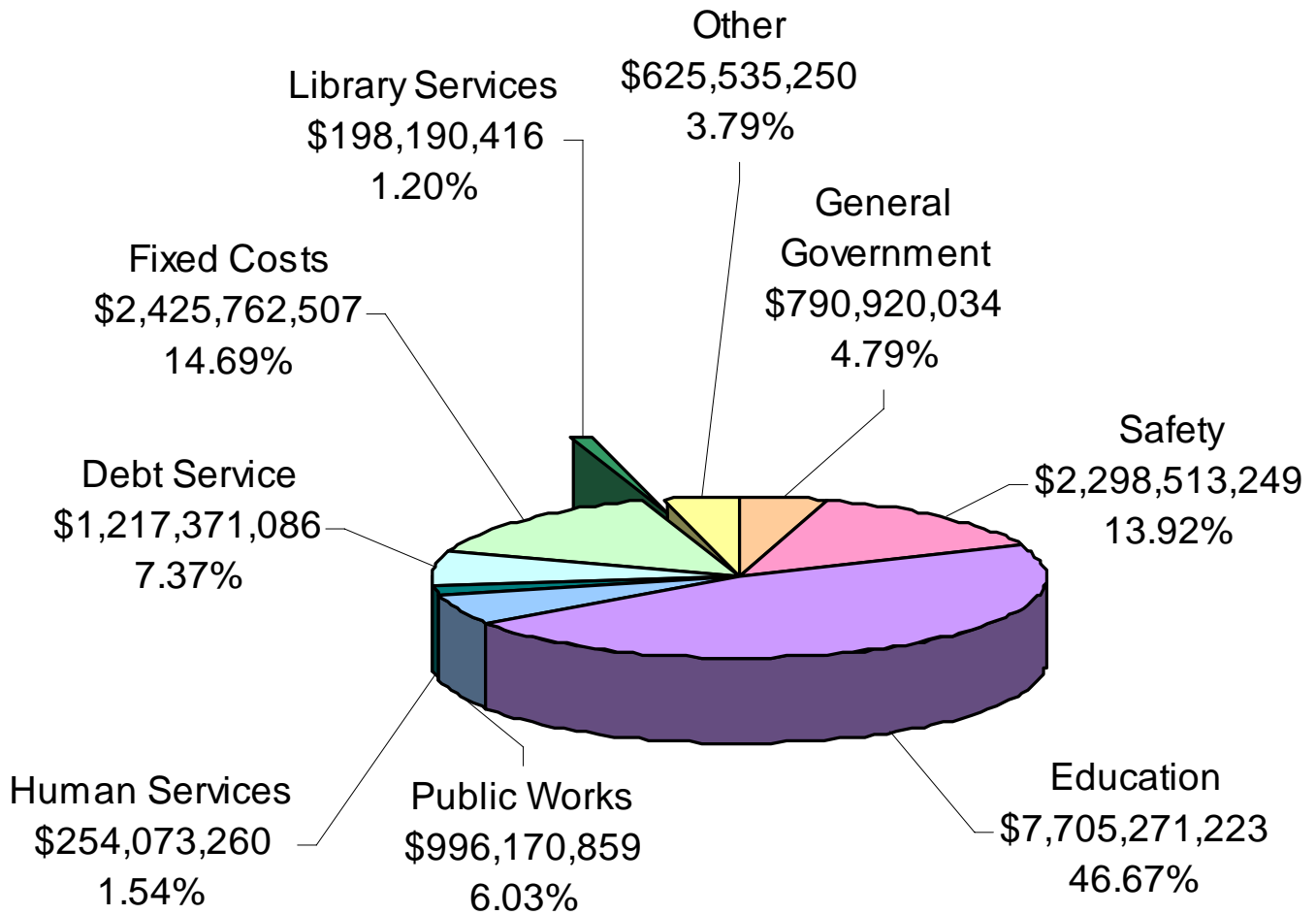
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Public Library Share of the FY2006 Massachusetts Municipal Pie

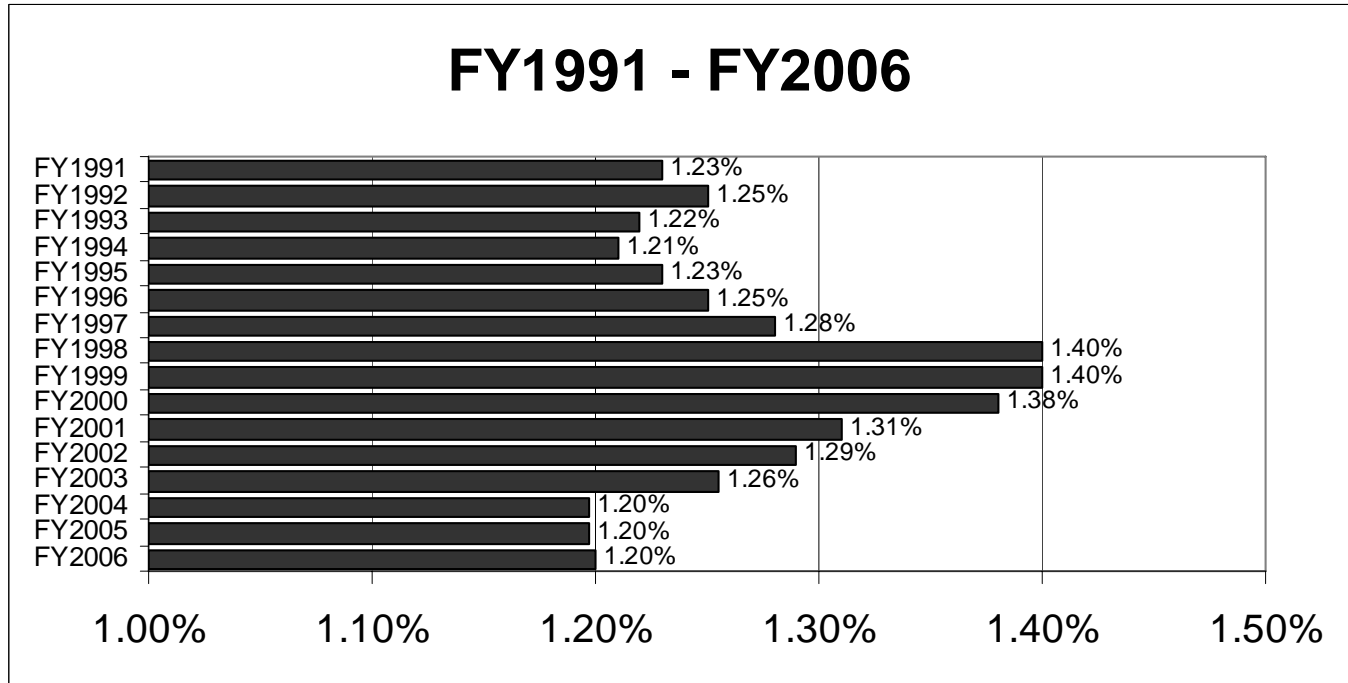

- **Children's Services, xxxx Data** (available in February)
Selected statistics related to children's services including staffing, programming, holdings and circulation.
- **Circulation and Holdings Report, FYxxxx** (available in January)
Various public library circulation and holdings raw data. Also includes circulation per FTE, per hour open and per capita and holdings per capita data.
- **Education & Staffing Report, 7-1-xxxx** (available in January)
Public library staffing levels and distribution of the staff's highest educational level. Staffing level data includes: total full-time equivalencies (FTE), number full time and part time, and FTE for MLS, librarian, children's librarian and non-custodian positions as well as total hours open per non-custodian FTE. Director's education level and length of work week are displayed.
- **Electronic Services, FYxxxx Data** (available in May)
Selected statistics related to electronic services including: website hits, number of users of public Internet computers, electronic subscriptions and materials in electronic format.
- **Featured Reports, FYxxxx Data** (available in the spring)
Reports on changing topics present public library data not displayed in other reports.
- **Financial Statistics Report, FYxxxx Data** (available in February)
Raw and per capita figures for each reporting public library's (including branches) total municipal appropriation, operating income, and salary, materials, other and total operating expenditures. Also included are percent of total operating expenditures spent for salaries, materials and other expenditures.
- **The FYxxxx Municipal Pie...What's Your Share?** (available in January)
Relates the amount expended from the general fund by each city and town on public library service, to the amount expended to operate the entire municipality.
- **Public Library Outlets, FYxxxx Data** (available in May)
Selected statistics relating to public library outlets including: staffing, holdings and circulation.
- **Rankings Report, xxxx Data** (available in March)
Each municipality's rank within its population group and within the entire state based on its library's per capita values for certain income and expenditure data. For services, the indicators are: FTE per 10,000 population, MLS FTE per 10,000, hours open per week, direct and total circulation per capita and holdings per capita.
- **Salaries Report, 7-1-xxxx** (available in January)
Hourly minimum and maximum salaries for up to 17 public library position classifications from Library Director to Custodian. Annual salary for the Library Director is also displayed.
- **Services Report, FYxxxx** (available in January)
Services data includes number of terminals with Internet, average weekly visits, reference questions and hours open. Counts are provided for weekend days open, branches, adult and children's programs and attendance. Average hours open on weekends is also shown.
- **Summary Tables and Graphs, xxxx Data** (available in March)
Statewide, population group and regional totals of various incomes, expenditures, holdings, circulation, services and staffing data. Subject index provided.
